Dear Friends

There is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn a new skill and get ready for the next round of rabbit mapping that will start later this year: Sally McIntosh, the Community Programs officer with Parks, Conservation and Lands and Andy Westcott, the coordinator of the Molonglo Catchment Group (MCG) will conduct a training session on the use of GPS (Global Positioning System) and on mapping. The training session will be this coming Friday, see below for more details (apologies for the short notice, I've only learned about this opportunity an hour ago). The training will equip you with the basics of recording locations in the field using a GPS device, downloading the data and displaying them on Google Earth.

The idea for the training came up during the mapping of rabbit warrens. Most volunteers involved with rabbit mapping found it much easier to use a GPS to record the warrens rather than to locate them on a printed map. Volunteers with no previous experience were trained on a variety of borrowed GPS devices. FoMM and MCG have successfully applied for funds to purchase Garmin 60 GPS devices which will be shared and which will make the training and future mapping of rabbits (and other items) a much easier effort. You can contact me or Sally (details below) for a GPS if you want to participate in the training.

This year's National Tree Day falls on Sunday, the 2 August 2009 and preparations are well under way to plant local trees in a cleared area of Mount Majura. Please find below the announcement with more details. Please visit [www.majura.org](http://www.majura.org) to view a map of the venue.

On Sunday, 26 July we'll conduct the final site preparation and start to water in. Drop in any time from 2.00pm to 5.00pm.

### **Learn a new skill: training session on GPS and mapping – this Friday 10 July**

The training is free of charge, will take about 2 hours and will cover the following: Basic GPS setup, marking waypoints, finding a waypoint, marking a track, calculating an area (eg the area of a patch of Serrated Tussock), using coordinates; uploading data from GPS to computer, and displaying data on Google earth.
